This seminar provides an introduction to the comparative analysis of international health care systems. It begins by examining the theoretical foundations of health systems research and introduces a multidimensional framework for analysing and classifying health systems. Building on OECD health statistics and other comparative data sources, the seminar discusses key indicators and criteria used to compare health systems across countries.

A further focus is placed on the characteristics and institutional features of selected health care systems. Students will analyse how different countries finance, provide and regulate health care and critically assess the extent to which policies and experiences from one health system can be transferred to another.

As part of the seminar, an organized optional excursion to the European Parliament in Strasbourg will provide students with the opportunity to gain insights into European institutions and to explore the European dimension of health policy.

International students are particularly encouraged to contribute their perspectives and are welcome to present and discuss the health care system of their home country.

This seminar is designed for students interested in social work with refugees in Germany and beyond. Germany is one of the leading destinations for people displaced by war and irregular migrants crossing into Europe. Therefore, Germany is one of Europe's largest recipients of refugee applications, serving as a top destination for refugees. The management of refugees highlights various barriers and complex issues, particularly for social workers, in the context of ensuring the integration of asylum seekers and refugees into the vocational training system and German society. This seminar aims to prepare students for international social work with immigrants, focusing on the knowledge and skills required by culturally competent social workers in social work education, practice, and research in the German context. What challenges do social workers face in Germany? Which social aspects are problematic for the practice of social work with refugees in German society? In what ways can the issue of race and racism inform antiracist social work practice? These are some of the questions that will be addressed in this seminar. Through explorative, research-based learning in groups, students will develop the thematic field step by step. Beginning with the formulation of problem definitions, uncertainties, and questions, students will learn and research basic information, the environment, and structures related to migration-induced diversity. Finally, they will engage in practical, outreach-based research. All groups will provide feedback in a presentation during the seminar. In the end, students will submit a term paper for the course.

In this seminar, we will read Amartya Sen's book "Identity and Violence", which he wrote in 2006. In this book, Sen examines the concept of identity. He argues that conflict and violence are often supported by the assumption of a unique identity. Drawing on postcolonial thought, he problematizes this presumption of a singular identity. His book is then a strong argument for the necessity of diversity - for the many different ways in which people see themselves, involving their gender, their language, their jobs, their cultural habits, their ways of knowing etc. This is a reading seminar. This implies that students are obliged to read selected chapters as preparation for each seminar. We will read the whole book during the seminar. Students are asked to get their own copy of the book before the seminar starts. The seminar is held in English.

The binational seminar builds on a longstanding academic partnership between German and Ukrainian universities, established in 2008. Originally founded between the Catholic University of Applied Sciences Freiburg and Yuriy Fedkovych Chernivtsi National University (CHNU), the partnership was expanded in 2024 to include the Ukrainian Catholic University (UCU) in Lviv.

The seminar brings together students and teaching staff from the participating universities in a binational learning and exchange process. Together, participants will explore current social challenges and examine professional approaches and methods for addressing them. Through critical discussion, comparative reflection, and the exchange of academic and professional perspectives, participants will consider the practical relevance and applicability of different approaches in the German and Ukrainian contexts.

A particular focus will be placed on similarities and differences between the two countries' social realities, welfare systems, and professional contexts. This comparative perspective will provide opportunities to question established approaches, learn from different experiences, and develop a deeper understanding of social work and social policy across national and cultural contexts.

In view of the ongoing war in Ukraine and its far-reaching social consequences—including displacement, forced migration, and the disruption of social structures and support systems—the seminar is both highly relevant and particularly timely. It offers a space for academic dialogue, professional exchange, and critical reflection on how social professions can respond to the challenges arising in times of war, crisis, and displacement.

Format and Schedule

Online sessions will take place regularly throughout both the winter and summer semesters of the 2026/27 academic year. In addition, an in-person seminar week is planned for each semester, providing participants with the opportunity to deepen their academic exchange and engage in intensive binational learning.

The (online) sessions will be held on Wednesday afternoons from 2:00 to 3:30 p.m. The exact starting date will be announced in due course.

The seminar welcomes students and teaching staff interested in exploring contemporary social challenges from a comparative German-Ukrainian perspective and in contributing to a sustained academic and professional dialogue between the two countries.

Neben einer Einführung in die beiden Länder mit ihren aktuellen sozialpolitischen Konflikten werden anhand konkreter Beispiele Methoden der psychosozialen Begleitung von Opfern des bewaffneten Konflikts in Kolumbien vorgestellt sowie ihre Übertragbarkeit auf Deutschland diskutiert. Dabei wird ein Blick auf die Traumabewältigung geworfen, die nicht allein mit Worten stattfinden muss. Voraussetzung für die Teilnahme an dem Seminar ist das Interesse am Globalen Süden.
